Our **Outpatient Clinics** provided 17,384 Telehealth visits to 1,897 clients, of whom 227 were children.

- Our clinics are located next door to the Rochester Transit Center, making access relatively easy.
- Both our Mental Health Clinic and our Restart Outpatient Clinic now offer personal and group counseling sessions using Telehealth technologies.
- Our mental health and addiction treatment programs are certified by the NationalHealth Service Corps. NHSC offers loan repayment and scholarship programs to clinicians on our team.

We provide services to over 500 individuals living with Intellectual/Developmental Disabilities

by providing housing, community supports and services through self-direction that foster inclusion and independence.

- We are the largest provider of Emergency Housing in Monroe County, serving over 3,000 people in 3 locations.
- Our addiction treatment residential programs serve men and women, and women with their young children, in Monroe and Wayne Counties.
- We operate 13 residential homes across in Monroe, Wayne and Yates counties, supporting adults living with intellectual and developmental disabilities.


